Important Solid Waste and Recycling Collection Information for 2021

Dear Resident,

Please be advised that Penn Waste, Inc has been awarded the Solid Waste Collection contract with Rye Township for the term of 1/1/21 - 12/31/23. We look forward to continuing to service the residents of Rye Township. Our goal is to provide you with superior customer service. Please review the contents of this flyer for useful information on your collection service.

Your weekly collection day is Tuesday. Please have your items placed at the curb prior to 6:00 AM as we will start promptly. Your weekly service will consist of four (4) 33 gallon bags or two (2) cans. Residents eligible to pay the senior rate are limited to two (2) 33 gallon bags or one (1) can. Please be aware that each bag or trash can receptacle must not exceed 33 gallons or 50 pounds. Overweight bags and cans are unsafe for our loaders to lift.

Trash placed out for collection within cans must also be bagged so as not to expose our workers to raw garbage.

 = Delayed Collection Due To Holiday

Observed holidays are noted in **RED**. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES



- Trash must be curbside by 6:00 AM on your collection day.
- Bags and cans must not exceed 33 gallons or 50 pounds. Weekly limit of 2 cans or 4 bags.
- Large items such as furniture, freezers, mattresses, broken garden tools, etc. will be collected curbside for a fee, but must be scheduled in advance with Penn Waste.
- Cardboard may be dropped off at Rye Township on New Valley Road M-F from 6 AM to 2 PM and placed in dumpster by resident.
- No electronics: TV, monitors, computers, printers etc. will be collected curbside.

Rye Township Snow Plowing Information

Rye Township Allows...

property owners to place mailboxes within the limits of the legal R-O-W out of respect for the U.S Postal Service's need to deliver and pick up mail for their customers. But because the boxes are within the R-O-W, damages due to snow that was thrown while plowing are the responsibility of the property owner.

The Road Crew works hard to ensure the roads stay safe during winter weather. We ask that motorists give our plow drivers a break by following a few tips:

- Remove all vehicles from roadways and place in driveways, where possible, when snow is in the forecast.
- Allow six car lengths behind an operating snow plow.
- Stay alert as slow-moving snow plows can be obscured by blowing snow.
- Safely move as far away from the centerline when approaching a snow plow head on. Maintaining safe and passable roads is the Township's top priority when dealing with winter weather. To help meet that need, the Township urges residents to not shovel snow onto roads that have already been plowed. Snow should not be shoveled onto any roadway as this can increase the potential for crashes, and property owners can be held liable for any resulting crashes.

Guidelines for shoveling or plowing snow on property adjacent to roadways:

- Snow should be shoveled or plowed to the right side of the driveway as you are facing the intersecting roadway. By piling the snow away from the oncoming direction of the snow plows, the snow will not be pushed back onto the driveway.
- Eliminate snow piles at the property entrance whenever possible. High accumulations of snow can obstruct the vision of motorists, posing a safety hazard.
- Do not push snow onto roadways at any time. This creates a hazardous condition for all vehicles.



Message From the Tax Collector

Taxpayer Flexibility: Senate Bill 1125, providing property tax payment relief, has passed. For the SCHOOL REAL ESTATE TAX BILLS, taxpayers will have the face period from October 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. There is no change to SCHOOL INSTALLMENT dates or amounts. This ruling comes after the district's tax distribution deadline and therefore the language was not included in the tax bills.

All PERRY COUNTY/RYE TOWNSHIP REAL ESTATE and PERSONAL TAX BILL dates and amounts remain unchanged. These bills are now in the penalty period. All residents of Rye Township who are 18 years of age or older should have received a Personal Tax Bill dated February 1, 2020. Most Personal Tax Bills are included in the same envelope as your County/Township Real Estate Tax Bill to save on postage. These Personal Tax Bills are NOT paid by your mortgage company and must be paid by the resident. Please pay these bills before they go to J.P. Harris for collection at the end of the year as significant additional fees will be incurred. If you have any questions, please contact Rebecca A. Schulze, Tax Collector at 717-836-5692.

Rye Recycles Cardboard!

Residents may bring flattened corrugated cardboard and shipping boxes to the Township's drop off location, located in the rear lot behind the municipal building.

Drop off hours are Monday - Friday, 6 AM to 2 PM. Closed on weekends and holidays. No other materials are accepted.

Bulk Item Collection

Residents may now dispose of Bulk Items curbside by contacting Penn Waste. Residents will be charged a fee, billed directly by Penn Waste, for this service. Once scheduled through our customer service department at 717-767-4456, residents may place the large item at the curb on the date scheduled.

Please make sure the item is not too heavy to be lifted by two people.

Unacceptable items include: Automobile parts, Car & Truck batteries, Chemicals, stains & liquids, Commercial/Industrial Waste, Construction material such as drywall, masonry, lumber, roofing shingles & tiles, Hazardous waste, Tires on rims and Electronic waste such as TVs and Computer Monitors.
